JOB TITLE: Adjunct Instructor - Physics

Job Summary: The Division of Arts and Sciences is seeking qualified candidates for a part-time Adjunct Instructor to teach College Physics I with Lab (4 credits) to Forensic Science and Biology majors in fall 2021. The course description and class schedule are given below for additional information:

PY 140 College Physics I with Lab (4 credit hours).

Lecture: Tuesday/Thursday 3:15-4:30 PM, Lab: Thursday 4:40-6:20 PM

This is the first semester of the two-semester course designed to provide the student with an overall view of the concepts, together with the ability to set up and solve simple problems in physics. Areas covered in two semesters include particle mechanics, heat, thermodynamics, sound, electricity, magnetism, light, and selected topics in modern and biophysics. The required laboratory will provide the student with practical knowledge of Physics and enhance the knowledge gained in the classroom. Prerequisite: MA 145

Appointment/Start Date: August 30, 2021

Requirements/Qualifications: Master's Degree in Physics or a related field is required. Theoretical knowledge and/or research experience in Biophysics are preferred but not required. Preference will be given to candidates with previous experience in teaching Physics at the college level. Successful candidates are expected to deliver the course materials through College Blackboard learning management system. Candidates must be able to work safely in a teaching lab, sit and stand for long periods in labs, lift and safely handle laboratory equipment, instructional models, chemicals, reagents, glassware, etc., as needed for teaching.
